ACTIVITY REPORT APRIL 2014 TO MARCH 2015

The year 2006 – the thought that ignited a spark has transformed into this social infrastructure called Chinmaya Vijaya; the year 2007 inaugurated with just 3 children in September of that year; now the year 2015 – it is housing 109 children; it has grown just not in numbers; the children too have turned into grown ups – a lot of change in every aspect that is satisfying; a great consolation to heart and mind; All this could be achieved not with that small idea but with the cooperation, dedication, concern, love and affection of everyone from the familiy, friends, community around and the guidance of many a people from the Mission made it a soul-satisfying accomplishment. Thanks one and all that stood behind and guided us through.

APRIL 2014:

All the children showed very good academic performance in their year ending examinations of 2013-2014 at the Indian Springs School, Gollapudi. All of them cleared with 'A'Grade in all their examinations. Through out the year they actively participated in all the cultural, extra and co-curricular activities organized by the school and won many prizes both in individual and group competitions. Their response to the attention being shown and their understanding of their responsibilities with all of them just ranging between the ages 5 and 14 with oneness in thought and action are really appreciable on their part.

The children had school vacations from 24th April to June 11, 2014. During this period they were engaged in many activities orgnized in Chinmaya Vijaya and also allowed to visit their native place for 10 days. A Dental Health Camp in association with with Sibar Dental College was organized on 24th April. Some of the children having severe dental ailments were taken to Sibar Dental College in groups and treatment provided.





MAY 2014:

A summer camp with the theme "Love Hanuman – Live Hanuman" was organized from 2nd May to 6th May 2014. Chinmaya Mission Volunteers from Mumbai, volunteers from Vijayawada and Guntur participated with the entire show organized by Brahmachari Kushal Chaitanya of Chinmaya Mission, Guntur. Br. Kushal

Chaitnya acts as an integral motivating mission person at Chinmaya Vijaya – every Sunday he preaches and imbibes moral values in the children; recite prayers and Bhajans of Gurudev and Swamiji – in short, he gives the children a devotional direction by his active involvement.





The above camp from 2nd May to 6th May organized under his guidance was a grand success due to Pujya Gurudev and Pubjya Guruji's Grace and blessings.

'The eight Sidhhis – Great powers of Hanuman" was the theme of the camp and the campers learnt these qualities (from Buddhi to Vaakpatutvam) through various workshops, satsangs, Acharya's sessions, craft activities etc. Qualities like Balam (strength and stamina); Nirbhayatvam (fearlessness); Ajaadyam (alertness) were instilled in them through the rigorous – yet fun-filled adventure sports organized by the Z Back team from Mumbai. The campers were given campkids, complete stationery set, tracksuits etc., by generous donors and sponsors from Mumbai. All the sessions were very interactive and thought provoking. If the 'Nutritious Bhel' (made by the campers) catered to their physical well-being, the quiz mde them intellectually alert and the making of Hanuman's backbone extremely innovative and crafty. The five-day camp ended very swiftly – just like Vayukumara crossed over to Lanka! In short, this camp was memorable for all – both campers and organizers!

On 8th May 2014, The Holy Birthday of HH Pujya Gurudev Swami Chinmayananda was celebrated at Chinmaya Vijaya with all pomp, geity and fervour. All the children neatly attired since early in the morning prepared themselves; recited prayers; rendered bhajans and spent the whole day in praise of Gurudev.

In order not to break away from their native affection and relationships, the children were allowed to visit their native places in different corners of the State from 10th May to 25th May 2014. They all visited their guardians and came back with cheerful visages with their young minds filled with happy reminisces. For sometime thereon they happily exchange the experiences they had among themselves and share plesantries.

JUNE 2014:

The School reopened on the 12th of June and the children were busy preparing for their new session since the 1st of June. They were fully ready with their text books, note books, bags, dress and everything in spic and span and started going to school from 12th onwards. The buses were back after regular maintenance and carried the children.

30th June 2014: The Birthday of Swami Tejomayananda was celebrated in the campus – the children and all the staff prepared themselves in neat and tidy dresses early in the morning and that being a regular school

day all the staff members and children gathered in the prayer hall; sang bhajans and prayed Swamiji for a clear direction on a right path in their lives. Swamiji showered his benevolent blessings on the children.

<u>July 2014</u>: The children were busy with their hectic school schedule and were busy completing their works assignments in a competitive spirit. This gives that they would excel in their areas with grit and determination in the days to come.

<u>August 2014</u>: This is a month adorned fully with festivals in the Hindu Almanac. The children had a joyous time around on all the festive days that fall one after the other with 'Rakshabandhan' on 10th of the month – The school celebrates this festival where the children tie Rakhis and share sweat-meats with each other.

Independence Day was celebrated in Chinmaya Vijaya on 15th August when the first trio that joined Chinmaya Vijaya in the very beginning hoisted the National Flag. The importance of the day was explained to all the children and the sacrifices made by our great leaders some even at the cost of their life was stressed to create a sense of belongingness towards the Society and the Nation.

<u>Sri Krishna Janmashtami</u> was celebrated on <u>17th August 2014</u> in the School and our children took active part singing the Bhajans and reciting prayers they learnt in the Aashram. All the staff members appreciated their initiative.

<u>Sri Ganesh Chaturthi</u> – a highly pompous festival for all Hindus was observed in all sincerity in the campus <u>on 29th August</u>. The children well prepared performed "Sri Ganesh Puja" and offered prayers to lead their life and career without any obstacles. Brahmachari Kushal Chaitanya performed 'Ganesh Puja' while Drs Sumathi Amma and AppaRao Mukkamala were also present. They blessed the children for a very healthy and prosporous life.





September 2014: The School 'Indian Springs, Gollapudi observed Teachers' Day on 5th Sep 2014 in memory of the Birth anniversary of Dr Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan, a great Educationist, Statesman, eminent Teacher, Philosopher and the first Vice President of free India. Children from Chinmaya Vijaya took active part in all the activities conducted in the school like debates, elocution and quiz competitions on this occasion.

On the 23rd Sep 2014 Swami Tejomayananda conducted sessions both in Guntur and Vijayawada – the Aadhyatmic session in Guntur took place at Sri Venkateswara Vignan Mandir and at Siddardha College in Vijayawada. All the Cord Trustees also participated in these Sessions. 20 Children from Chinmaya Vijaya were

taken to these sessions at Guntur and Vijayawada – they recited "Vishnu Sahasranamam" and "Veda Suktam" in presence of Swamiji.





On 25th Sep 2014 all the Trustees from CORD visited Chinmaya Vijaya and stayed there in the campus. A small temple with the statue of Pujya Gurudev HH Swami Chinmayananda was constructed in the premises of Chinmaya Vijaya. HH Swami Tejomayananda visited Chinmaya Vijaya on 26th; Acharyas, volunteers, CHICKS and general public from various places gathered in large numbers in the Campus; children received Swamiji at the main entrance and led him upto the Temple with March Past; and all the CORD Trustees also attended the Pujya Gurudev's temple consecretation ceremony on 26th Sep 2014 along with Swamiji. Swamiji performed the 'Deeparadhana' and distributed 'Prasadam" to all. Later Swamiji gave His message and blessings to the children and all the participants. Dr Sumathi and Dr AppaRao Mukkamla accompanied and stayed with Swamiji in the Campus through out His stay.

In the afternoon of 26th September CORD Trustees had their meeting in the Old Age Home at Chinmaya Vijaya in which HH Swamiji also took part. After the meeting they all left for their different places after receiving the kind blessings from Swamiji.

October 2014: The important Hindu festivals of Dussehara (Durga Puja) and Deepavali fall in the month of October. On 2nd October the children participated in 'Gandhi Jayanthi' Celebrations organized at their School. On 3rd October to 5th October – Durgashtami, Maharnavami and Vijaya Dashami – were respectively observed in the Campus being part of Dussehara celeb rations. Children offered prayers to Goddess Durga and Poojya Gurudev. On the same day Brahmachari Kushal Chaitanya, Brahmachari Venkata Chaitanya alongwith a contingent of 9 mission members visited the Aashram and conducted competition among the children on the 14th Chapter of Bhagawad Gita. They later distributed "Service to the Humanity" participation certificates to all the participants.



On 19th October the 98th Birthday of Sri Sharad Srikhande who is a permanent inmate of the Old Age Home was celebrated among the children. Children sang prayers for his long healthy life and Sri Srikhande gave his blessings to the children.





On 23rd October 2014 – the children were very happy performing Lakshmi Puja on the festival of lights – Diwali; Some foreigners from USA that originally viisited Eluru Medical College made a special visit to the Aasram; All the buildings were beutifully decorted with electrical lights; the children had a very joyful time, fired Diwali crackers in the evening and exchanged sweets among each other. Hopefully the Festival of Lights brings in enlightenment in their lives.





NOVEMBER 2014:

On 14th Nov 2014 'Children's Day' was organized at Indian Springs School in memory of the Birth Annivarsary of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of Independent India; all the students of the Aashram too participated in the various activities conducted in the school.

On 30th Nov 2014 five of our children participated in the 'District Level Competition on the 14th Chapter of Bhagawad Gita" conducted by Chinmaya Mission and two of our children viz., Ms J Sahithi (Nancharamma) and Ms G.Tejaswi were selected and they received prizes.



Dr Sumathi Mukkamala accompanied the children and took active part in organizing the competition.

DECEMBER 2014:

4th December 2014: This is a day the children in the Aashram fondly look forward to convey their love to Dr Sumathi Mukkamala whom they all affectionately call "AMMA (Mother)".
